Director's Report

For the last few years, I have had the privilege of compiling the Chairman's Report for our Annual Report comfortable in the knowledge that we have had another highly successful year of helping those in the communities in which we operate. Pebbles has done so by educating children, providing safe and secure learning opportunities, as well as through the provision of healthcare, nourishment and counselling.

For the first 9 months of the previous financial year, that situation continued, and we were looking forward to maintaining our enviable record of progress, thanks to the unstinting efforts of all of our staff, in whatever capacity, and the guidance of my fellow Trustees.

And then, of course, the whole world was thrown into chaos by the threat of the Covid-19 pandemic......

The majority of our activities had to be curtailed, and at this stage we have no idea when we will be able to re-commence operations, and what levels of service we will be able to provide, whilst maintaining the necessary safety protocols. Sophia and the Senior Management Team immediately put a plan together to try and ensure that the organisation can restore our operations to as high a level as possible as soon as possible.

The one major operation that has continued, and indeed has expanded rapidly, is our feeding programme, whereby we have distributed many thousands of meals to needy communities in the Winelands Region, and for this we owe a deep debt of gratitude to our Kitchen and Nutrition Programme sponsors, the Stichting Clouds Foundation in Holland.

The other major achievement of the year has been the wonderful success of the Pebbles Project Academy in Hemel-en-Aarde, in partnership with Freudenberg Help e.V., Rotary Hermanus, Rotary International, The Cape Wine Auction Trust and other generous individual donors.

In conclusion, nobody can know in what situation the Pebbles Project will find itself in the months ahead, but we can rest assured that with the efforts of our Management, Staff, Sponsors and Donors, we will make every effort to ensure that we continue to provide the necessary care to those most in need.

But the captain does not work alone.


He or she has a highly skilled crew,


Pebbles Project UK Directors 2019 - 2020


Senior Management Team 2019 – 2020


Programme and Admin Expenses 2019 - 2020



Number of Facilities and Staff Trained 2005 - 2020




Income Sources 2019 - 2020






Beneficiary Numbers 2005 - 2020

4 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- 96% of all sick clients who visited the clinic were assisted by our staff, only 4% had to be referred to a hospital.

- 1003 toothbrushes were dispensed through the brushing programme.
- 3 0% teen pregnancy rate for our learners participating in the Sexual Health programme.

Research was conducted on a sample of 462 Pebbles children who form part of the nutrition programme with the following findings:



- In July 2019, 3 new farms were added to the programme, 2 in Citrusdal and 1 in Wellington.
- The Pebbles Kitchen scored over 80% in the first professional health and safety audit, and received some guidelines to enable any issues to be addressed.

Community Programme

3 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- To commemorate Youth Day 2019, Pebbles hosted its first 'Pebbles Got Talent' show at Adam Smal theatre in Stellenbosch. The hugely successful show enabled some talented youngsters to share their skills and brought communities together.
- International Day of Older Persons is celebrated annually on 1st October and our older generation on the farms were treated to a day of great food, fun entertainment and good company.
- Leadership for Life is an integral thread woven through the community programme and provides vital skills to participants, inspiring them to take on their own challenging projects. Our 50 participants worked together to provide Christmas Shoeboxes of Love for the children on their farms.

2 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- The month of May is Child Protection Month in South Africa. During the week of 28 May to 4 June 2019 numerous activities, workshops and educational experiences were facilitated to create awareness in families and farming communities.
- Male teenager learners were included in the Sexual Health sessions to enable them to make informed and healthy choices.

3 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Pebbles Academy (Hermanus) opened its doors to 34 learners in July 2019, with the numbers increasing to 63 at the beginning of 2020. The Academy provides quality education for learners from Grade R to Grade 9.
- The newly renovated ECD centre was completed in April 2019 and comprises of three large classrooms, a fully functional kitchen, children's bathroom, staff facilities and a large, safely secured outdoor play area which includes a jungle gym, swings and a sandpit.
- The new centre, with its increased space has meant that learner numbers could be increased from 38 to 50 learners between the ages of 5 months and 5 years.

 The addition of more Academy classrooms, a main hall, a skills centre and an ablution block has opened up opportunities for current learners and the wider community. In future the facility will be able to provide services to school leavers as well as unemployed youth and adults from the surrounding HeA community.

The Jo Clifton Award

He arrived for work an hour early every day to clean his bus for his important passengers. He demonstrated the qualities that Pebbles aims to instill in our beneficiaries.

Andrew's family continues to support this award by attending the prize giving every year. They also donate a special gift for the winner to congratulate them on their success.

The Andrew Fredericks Award is given to a Pebbles learner who embodies the same generous character that Andrew displayed.

The 2019 Andrew Fredericks Award was presented to Melodine Van Rooyen, a 15 year old learner from Kaapzicht farm.

The Eugene Isaacs Award

Eugene tragically passed away in an accident on the 25th of November, 2016. He was 15 years old. He was a passionate, kind and driven young man. The Eugene Isaacs Fund was created to celebrate learners like Eugene who show the potential to become exceptional leaders. These leaders strive towards academic excellence as well as being passionate about their communities.

At the end of the year, one (or more) Ambassador(s) will receive a financial contribution towards their tuition, sports equipment, school fees or any other academic need that they might have. Additionally, the chosen Ambassador will receive a floating trophy of recognition for showing these attributes: academic excellence and participation in community service. This legacy will hopefully inspire learners to work hard and excel as well as showing compassion for their community.

Elze Pietersen (11 years old) from Koopmanskloof farm and Lorenzo Mouton (17 years old) from L'Avenir farm were the chosen recipients of the 2019 Eugene Isaacs Award.

The Hans Hessler Award

This award is in honour of a donor named Hans Hessler, a Canadian gentleman with a deep love for South Africa. Mr Hessler made a monthly contribution to Pebbles from 2014 until his death in December 2018.
